Course descriptions and objectives: This course is an Area B course that develops key competencies in critical thinking and communication through an introduction to American participation in the Second World War. The course includes a Critical Thinking and Oral Communications Component (CTOC). The course offers students the opportunity to apply critical thinking skills to history and to gain experience in developing and presenting original arguments in an oral form.

Student Learning Outcomes: By the end of the course, the successful student should (SLO):

1. Assimilate, analyze and present thoughts and opinions in oral forms (Goal B. Outcome).
2. Demonstrate the abilities to analyze, or interpret evidence or arguments, in order to formulate and support new arguments or solve problems. (Goal III Critical Thinking)

3. Demonstrate in oral and written form an understanding of America's role in the First World War and its effects on American and world history.

Attendance policies: Students whose number of absences is more than twice the number of class meetings per week (4 per semester) may be assigned a failing grade for the course at the discretion of the instructor. Students who have more absences than the number of class meetings per week but less than twice the number of class meetings per week (3 per semester), may be docked a letter grade for the class at the discretion of the instructor. Students who have absences which are less than or equal to the number of class meetings per week (1 or 2 per semester) will not be penalized.

The instructor endeavors to begin class punctually. If a student is not in his seat when the roll is called, or if a student leaves class early, the student will be recorded as tardy. Two tardies equals one absence. If you anticipate being late to class please notify the instructor beforehand.
