Course descriptions and objectives: This course is a survey of development of world history from early modern times to the present. Special emphasis will be placed on the political, intellectual, cultural and economic aspects of modern civilizations in the world environment.

Student Learning Outcomes: By the end of the course, the successful student should (SLO): demonstrate an understanding of political, social, economic institutional and cultural developments across the globe. The student will write an essay to explain political, social, economic, institutional or cultural developments in a global context. For example, the essay should trace the development of a theme or themes over time, or compare two or more cultures.

Attendance policies: Students whose number of absences is more than twice the number of class meetings per week (4 per semester) may be assigned a failing grade for the course at the discretion of the instructor. Students who have more absences than the number of class meetings per week but less than twice the number of class meetings per week (3 per semester), may be docked a letter grade for the class at the discretion of the

instructor. Students who have absences which are less than or equal to the number of class meetings per week (1 or 2 per semester) will not be penalized.

The instructor endeavors to begin class punctually. If a student is not in his seat when the roll is called, or if a student leaves class early, the student will be recorded as tardy. Two tardies equals one absence. If you anticipate being late to class please notify the instructor beforehand.
